In the last year, she has been involved in research that seeks to integrate her interest in social justice, advocacy, and intimate partner violence.

Through the support of a Strategic Awards for Research Transitions grant from UMBC, she has been conducting interviews with women who were involved in the early years of what was known as the battered women's movement. She has spoken to women from various states who were involved at the local, state, and national levels, advocating for services for victims and survivors, coordinated community responses, and the passage of legislation at the state and national levels. While listening to these women she has heard stories of resiliency, determination, and passion to bring about social change, the hallmarks of advocacy. Council on Social Work Education Reaffirmation

On August 1, 2017 faculty of the Baccalaureate Social Work Program submitted their three volume self-study to the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) to initiate the re-accreditation process. The purposes of accreditation are quality assurance, academic improvement, and public accountability.

The self-study is central to the accreditation process. It involves the program's self-examination that takes approximately two years to complete. It begins with a review of the program's mission, curriculum and operations relative to accreditation standards which include nine social work competencies. Sometime during December, 2017 and January, 2017 a site visitor from CSWE will visit the social work programs on the UMBC and USG campuses. This site visit, along with the self-study, will result in a report from CSWE in June, 2018 defining the program's strengths and areas that need improvement. Comments from the report will be discussed in the Fall, 2018 newsletter.

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
